

Ahmad's Response Breakdown:

Ahmad says: "Yes and this halaqah is talking about a part of the Islamic creed. You can help people look for this meaning in their daily lives. Someone may go to school because his parents wants him to. You can help them see that going to school can be rewarded in the sight of his Lord."

Response:

That's exactly my point — Islam already provides the meaning. You don't need to "look for" something that's already clearly given in revelation. If someone is going to school just because their parents want them to, then they're not doing it for Allah. They're just following people. The correct intention would be going to school to obey the parents for the sake of Allah, which is already part of Islam. That's not "spirituality," that's just Islam. You're calling it spirituality when it's just submission. The danger here is that you're taking what's already part of the deen and dressing it up as a "deeper" concept. That's misleading. You're labeling something man-made as if it's from the religion.

Ahmad also says: "I don't understand what you mean brother, what's your goal? Solve the whole halaqah now? Just attend it and you'll see what he'll talk about."

Response:

If something is \blacksquare ar \blacksquare m, I don't need to wait and "see what he'll talk about." I don't attend something that's built on a false foundation just to hear the rest of the lie. If a talk is based on a false concept — like "spirituality in Islam" — then the whole thing is void. The Prophet (\blacksquare) said: "Whoever introduces into this affair of ours that which is not from it, it is rejected." It's not about me solving the halaqah — it's about recognizing that it shouldn't exist in the first place.

The key is the distinction between a truly private club and a business that is open to the public, which falls under public accommodation laws and cannot discriminate. However, the level of privacy, the club's purpose, and whether it receives tax benefits can impact the legality of membership policies, especially if a club is considered a public accommodation. This is a public club for students at a university, and it does receive a tax benefit. They're fucked, bro.
